## Lloyd N. Olson

Lloyd Norman Olson was born November 5, 1923, in Langdon, North Dakota, and died Sunday afternoon, December 23, 2007, at Emerald Crest Assisted Living in Minnetonka. Lloyd farmed for the first 30+ years of his life. He was the only person in the county to get a perfect score on the 8<sup>th</sup> grade arithmetic exam. After his back surgery in which he was the second person in history to have spinal fusion at the Mayo Clinic, he attended Minneapolis Business College and became an accountant. At age 39, he married Elizabeth Walter; they were married for 36 years until Elizabeth's death in 2000. For their 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary, they vacationed in Hawaii. Lloyd worked for and was later part owner of N. R. Hansemann Company (later called Hanco) until his retirement in 1989.

He is preceded in death by his wife, Elizabeth Sarah (Walter) Olson; brothers Erling and his wife, Anna Mae, Henry, Hans, Andrew and his wife, Helen, and Olin and his wife, Ethel, all of Langdon, North Dakota; and brother-in-law Howard Marsden of Pekin, Illinois.
