After these dinners, there was usually a household game of some sort played by both the adults and children. *Leona lived to the age of 93. Although she didn't reach the "Century" mark as her siblings did, she had a full and active life until her death. She witnessed life without running water, indoor plumbing, and no electricity to today's age of electronics. It would be hard to imagine another 93 year period of time where life changed so dramatically.*
